What inspired this project?: The idea for Turtle Island NFT was sparked by a phone call—an unexpected one from someone our founder hadn't heard from in years. He was from a reserve in Manitoba and shared that his community still didn't have access to clean drinking water. He knew about their position and reached out in hopes that they might be able to help.

While honored to be thought of, they weren't in a position to send aid or fix the issue directly. But it lit a fire. They started asking bigger questions: *If I can't change this alone, how can I help in other ways? How can I get resources to the right people? And how can I shift the way people learn about Indigenous culture—so it's not always framed by pain, but by resilience, creativity, and joy?*

That was the beginning of Turtle Island NFT and our playful, educational initiative called *Tortoise Tasks*. We wanted to create something that could make cultural learning more accessible—something that celebrates our stories, art, and humour while still inspiring meaningful action.

Tortoise Tasks: This is a self-paced experience that aims to help the environment, educate people on Indigenous culture and issues while creating a better society. After the first unmarked graves were found in Canada, many non-Indigenous people approached us wanting to know what they could do to learn and help. We soon realized that we could help them learn the histories of our people while coming to appreciate our culture. We have created tasks to help educate others; they include things like taking an Indigenous elder out for lunch, visiting a Friendship Centre or attending a Powwow. We can walk together as one people towards healing and learning from each other.
